## Paper Publication

Authors must carefully follow each step to ensure successful publication.


### Step 1: Identify a Suitable Journal

The first and most important step is to identify a journal that is suitable for the research paper. The selected journal must align with the aim, scope, and subject area of the proposed research. Authors should carefully read the journal Aims and Scope section available on the journal official website (About). If the research topic, methodology, and application domain of the paper match the journal scope, it increases the chances of acceptance and reduces the likelihood of desk rejection.

### Step 2: Evaluate Journal Quality and Impact

Once the journal aim and scope match the paper, the next step is to evaluate the quality and publisher of the journal. Important factors to check:

- Impact Factor
- Journal indexing (SCI, SCIE, and Scopus)
- Publisher (Elsevier, Springer, IEEE, Wiley, and Taylor)
- Publication Timeline

### Step 3: Review Author Guidelines

After selecting the journal, authors must carefully follow the Author Guidelines which include:

- Paper format and structure
- Word limits and reference style
- Figure and table requirements
- Ethical and Publication policies (Open access only or Hybrid)

**Abstract**

Please provide a structured abstract of 150 to 250 words which should be divided into the following sections:

- Purpose (stating the main purposes and research question)
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusion

*For life science journals only (when applicable)*

- Trial registration number and date of registration for prospectively registered trials
- Trial registration number and date of registration followed by “retrospectively registered”, for retrospectively registered trials

**Keywords**

Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.

**Text****Text Formatting**

Manuscripts should be submitted in Word.

- Use a normal, plain font (e.g., 10-point Times Roman) for text.
- Use italics for emphasis.
- Use the automatic page numbering function to number the pages.
- Do not use field functions.
- Use tab stops or other commands for indents, not the space bar.
- Use the table function, not spreadsheets, to make tables.
- Use the equation editor or MathType for equations.
- Save your file in docx format (Word 2007 or higher) or doc format (older Word versions).

**Author guidelines example****Statement and Declarations**

**Author contributions:** In this section defines each authors role.

**Funding Disclosure:** Lists all funding sources and support received for the research.

**Conflicts of Interest:** In this section declares any financial or non-financial relationship that could influence the work.

**Ethical approval & consent:** In this section is used to confirms adherence to guidelines stating ethical committee approvals and informed consent for Human/animal studies.

**Data availability:** States where raw data, code, or, materials can be assessed or if they aren't available.

**Step 4: Manuscript Submission**

The paper is submitted through the Editorial Manager. Required documents generally include:

- Manuscript file
- Cover letter
- Highlights or graphical abstract (if required)
- Ethical declarations

Based on reviewer comments, the paper may be:


- Accepted




